How do you study the Bible for All It's Worth?

Begin by choosing a sound readable study bible in the correct print size
--visit the Bible Station Today and get a study bible--

Establish a Daily Appointment with God

- Private place with NO DISTRACTIONS
- Comfortable yet workable place
- Put it in your Schedule
- Select best time when you are ready

Devise a Bible Study Plan

- Book in the Bible (suggestion: Philippians)
- Person in the Bible
- Topic in the Bible
- Chapter in the Bible
- Word in the Bible

CAUTION: It Takes Hard Work! (2 Timothy 2:15 & Acts 17:11)

Priority #1 Discover the Original Intended Meaning of the Text

Step 1: Pray! Open my eyes that I may see the wonderful things in your Word. Psalm 119:18

Step 2: REVIEW the Basics of the Book

Questions

- 1. Where is it located? (OT or NT-section)
- 2. Who is the author?
- 3. What is the setting/historical background?
- 4. When was it written?
- 5. Who was it written to?
- 6. What is the outline?
- 7. What is the purpose?

8. What type of literature is it?

Basics found in a Study Bible

Example: Basics of Philippians

Step 3: READ the Text (and context) Over & Over

ALWAYS read what comes before & after selected text NEVER Only Read 1 Verse

"Any Text Without A Context is a Pretext for a Proof text" Dr. D.A. Carson

Step 4: RECORD Your Observations

- Record Words, Phrases, Clauses
- Record Questions
- Record Grammatical Issues (similes, metaphors; rhetorical?, symbols)
- Record Peculiarities
- Record Thoughts & Impressions
- Record Cross References

Step 5: RESEARCH Your Observations

- 4. Bible Handbooks

Step 6: REFLECT on Your Findings and Write down God's original intended meaning in one paragraph

Example of steps 1-6: Philippians 1:9-11: ⁹ And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, ¹⁰ so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, ¹¹ filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ—to the glory and praise of God.
